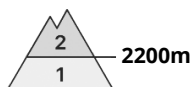
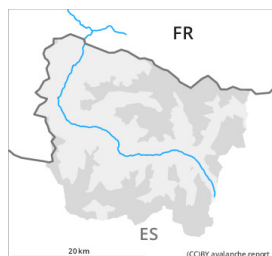


Danger Level 2 - Moderate



Tendency: Increasing avalanche danger 
on Friday 16 12 2022



Snowpack stability: **poor**
Frequency: **some**
Avalanche size: **medium**



Snowpack stability: **fair**
Frequency: **few**
Avalanche size: **medium**

Fresh wind slabs represent the main danger.

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Snowpack

Outgoing longwave radiation during the night will be quite good. Above approximately 2000 m snow will fall until midday. Up to 5 cm of snow, but less in some localities, will fall.

The more recent wind slabs are bonding poorly with the old snowpack in particular on wind-protected shady slopes above approximately 2200 m.

Above approximately 2000 m there are 40 to 60 cm of snow, and even more in some localities. At high altitudes and in high Alpine regions snow depths vary greatly, depending on the influence of the wind.

Tendency

Friday: Gradual increase in avalanche danger as a consequence of new snow and wind.
