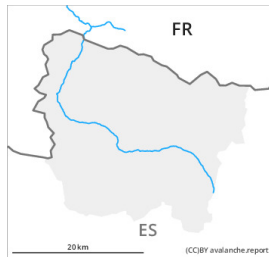
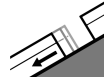


Danger Level 1 - Low



Tendency: Constant avalanche danger →
on Tuesday 31 December 2024



Gliding snow



Frequency: **few**

Avalanche size: **medium**

Gliding avalanches are possible in isolated cases as before.

As the temperature drops a favourable early-morning avalanche situation will be encountered over a wide area. On very steep grassy slopes individual gliding avalanches are possible as the day progresses, even medium-sized ones.

Caution is to be exercised in areas with glide cracks. Steep shady slopes: There is a danger of falling on the icy crust.

Snowpack

Sunny slopes: The surface of the snowpack will freeze to form a strong crust and will soften later than the day before. Shady slopes: The upper section of the snowpack is hard and its surface has a resilient crust. Towards its base, the snowpack is dry.

At intermediate altitudes there are 40 to 80 cm of snow, and even more in some localities. Above the tree line snow depths vary greatly, depending on the influence of the wind.

Tendency

Tuesday: The danger of gliding avalanches will persist.
